Subject: Appeal against refusal to grant a Private Hire Driver's Licence -

Applicant U

Report of: Head of Licensing and Safer Communities

Purpose of Report

To consider the appeal made by Applicant U against the refusal by the Council to grant a Private Hire Driver's Licence.

2. Background

2.1 Applicant U applied for a Private Hire Driver's Licence in April 2023. The Council refused to progress the application due to the driving endorsements declared by the applicant.

Applicant U has the following motoring convictions recorded on his driving licence:

- 21 May 2021 SP30 – Exceeding statutory speed limit on a public road Penalty Points - 3
- 24 February 2021
 MS90 Failure to give information as to identity of driver etc Penalty Points – 6

The application form is attached at Appendix 1
The driving licence endorsements are attached at Appendix 2

2.2 The legislation relating to the refusal to grant a driver's licence is contained under the provisions of the LG(MP)A 1976, section 51, whereby at 51.(1) subject to the provisions of this part of this Act, a district council shall, on receipt of an application from any person for the grant of a licence to drive private hire vehicles, grant to that person a driver's licence:

Provided that a district council shall not grant a licence-

(a) unless they are satisfied that the Applicant U is a fit and proper

person to hold a driver's licence: or

(b) to any person who has not for at least twelve months been and is not at the date of the application for a driver's licence, the holder of a licence granted under Part III of the Act of 1972 (not being a provisional licence) authorising him to drive a motor car.

- (2) A district council may attach to the grant of a licence under this section such conditions as they may consider reasonably necessary.
- (3) It shall be the duty of a council by which licences are granted in pursuance of this section to enter, in a register maintained by the council for the purpose, the following particulars of each such licence, namely-

(a) the name of the person to whom it is granted;

(b) the date on which and the period for which granted; and

(c) if the licence has a serial number, that number, and to keep the register available at its principal offices for inspection by members of the public during office hours free of charge.

Under S52. Any person aggrieved by -

- the refusal of the district council to grant a driver's licence under section 51 of this Act; or
- (2) any conditions attached to the grant of a driver's licence;

may appeal to a magistrate's court.

3.2 Castle Point Hackney Carriage and Private Hire Licensing Policy Assessment of Previous Convictions

Guidance on assessment of previous convictions was contained within the Department for Transport's (DFT) Statutory Taxi and Private Hire Vehicle Standards released in July 2020. These standards were adopted by the Council in November 2020 following a period of consultation and include the following in relation to driving offences:

Offence	Elapsed period before licence should be issued
Applicants with multiple driving offences	May indicate that an applicant does not exhibit the behaviours of a safe road user and one that is suitable to drive professionally

The full Assessment of Convictions is attached at Appendix 3.

4. 'Fit and Proper'

The definition of what is a fit and proper person is not defined in law however the generally accepted test is:

- Would you allow your son, daughter, mother, spouse or other person you care about to get into a vehicle with this person alone?

This definition was supported in the judgement by HHJ Silber in the case of Leeds City Council v Hussain which surrounds the suspension of a driver:

...'the purpose of the power of suspension is to protect the users of licensed vehicles and those who are driven by them and members of the public. Its purpose is to prevent licences being given or used by those who are not suitable people taking into account their driving record, their driving experience, their sobriety, mental and physical fitness, honesty and that they are people who would not take advantage of their employment to abuse or assault people.'

As Applicant U has the above convictions and has been refused a licence by two other local authorities he is not regarded as a fit and proper person to hold a Private Hire Driver's Licence and the Council made the decision to refuse the application.

Applicant U submitted a written appeal against this decision to the Council by email on 18 May 2023. A copy is attached at Appendix 4.

5. Legal implications

Decisions in relation to the grant of a licence give rise to the obligations under the Human Rights Act 1998. The Council will therefore ensure that there is a review hearing before the Licensing Sub-Committee. It should be noted that Applicant U has the right to appeal the decision made by the Council to the Magistrates Court if he is aggrieved by the decision of the Sub-Committee.

6. Options

The Sub-Committee is advised that it has the following options when determining this application.

- Uphold the decision to refuse the Private Hire Driver's Licence application
- (ii) Allow the Private Hire Driver's Licence application to progress.

Recommendation

The decision of the Sub Committee is required following proper consideration

of the application and any representations made to the Sub Committee.

A change in legislation means that, from the 15th November 2021, drivers will be able to choose to take a lorry or bus trailer test without having to take a test in the rigid vehicle first.

An additional legislative change from the 16th December 2021 also means that drivers with B (Car) entitlement will automatically have B+E (Car & Trailer) entitlement without the need to take a B+E test. This will allow licence holders to tow a vehicle up to 3,500kg Maximum Authorised Mass (MAM).

Please note that these changes will not be reflected on current driving licences, or on any of our online services. There is no need to contact DVLA regarding this change, photocard driving licences will be updated the next time licence holders transact with DVLA.

Assessment of Previous Convictions

Legislation specifically identifies offences involving dishonesty, indecency or violence as a concern when assessing whether an individual is fit and proper. The following reflects this.

Each case will be considered on its own merits and applicants / licensees are entitled to a fair and impartial consideration of their application.

Where a period is given below it will be taken to be a **minimum** in considering whether a licence should be granted or renewed in most cases. This puts passenger safety first while enabling past offenders to sufficiently evidence that they have rehabilitated.

Dear: To Whom it May Concern,

Appeal Regarding Private Hire Driver's Licence

I make reference to your letter dated April 21,2022 regarding my application for the Private Hire Driver's licence, in which I was denied on the ground that I am not a fit and proper person to hold a Driver's licence pursuant to a.51(1) of the LGMPA Act of 1976.

The basis for my refusal was mainly on the ground of my multiple driving offences and I do agree that it is a valid ground however, I argue that this is unreasonable taking into consideration all the relevant factors. I am a scaffolder for over twenty years and a father of three. My reason for change in occupation is that of convenience, health considerations and the financial ability to adequately maintain my family. It must be mentioned that I possess a clean criminal record and this should be considered in determining that I am able to hold Private Hire Driver's licence.

The definition of "Fit and Proper" as described in the letter describes a person that can be trusted to drive safely with family members. I do satisfy this criteria as I ever so often travel with my two daughters as the sole driver in picking up\dropping off to and from school on a weekly basis. Furthermore I have been driving for over 6 years and maintain a sober mindset around the steering wheel as I am not a person that practices drinking alcohol. I am mentally sound and physically able to drive as my health record indicates that there are no current illnesses that can substantially impair my ability to drive therefore making me a fit and proper person.

I am honest and very Hardworking man and I would not take advantage of this opportunity to harass anyone as my criminal records shows no charges for harassment and I am only concerned about how I can be productive and improve on the job daily.

I do realize that I have nine points that are currently on my Driver's licence as evidence of my misconduct. On February 24, 2024 six points will be removed and on May 21,2024 the final three points be removed. Therefore as of Mid next year my driving irregularities will be wiped clean and would genuinely prefer if possible that the Private Hire licence be granted when my driving record is clean.

In taking into consideration all the relevant circumstances my driving irregularities—are present but my entire character shows that I satisfy every other criteria—required in order to obtain the Private Hire licence and it would be reasonable to do so. I humbly ask that all these considerations will be valued and if I am not able to obtain the licence this year I could obtain it next year when my driving record is wiped clean.
