# 1. Purpose of Report

To consider an application for a Premises Licence to sell/supply alcohol and provide regulated entertainment at Tasty Bites restaurant, 275-277 High Road, Benfleet, Essex, SS7 5HA.

# 2. Background

- 2.1 The application has been submitted to all the Relevant Responsible Authorities as follows:
  - Licensing Department
  - Essex Police
  - Essex County Fire & Rescue Service
  - Planning Services
  - Environmental Health Service
  - The Health & Safety Executive
  - Children's Safeguarding Service (Essex County Council)
  - Essex Trading Standards
  - Director of Public Health (Essex County Council)
- 2.2 Details of the application were also advertised on the Council's website and blue notices displayed on lampposts near to the premises.

#### 3. Application

- 3.1 The application is for the following provisions:
  - Opening hours 08.00hrs to 23.00hrs
  - Performance of live music (indoors) Monday to Sunday 11:00hrs to 23:00hrs

- The supply of alcohol on the premises Monday to Sunday 11:00hrs to 23:00hrs.
- 3.2 It should be noted that under a change in regulations whilst the applicant has applied for a licence for the performance of live music; (or the playing of recorded music) a licence is not required to stage this if:
  - It takes place between 08.00hrs and 23:00hrs
  - It takes place at an alcohol on-licensed premises; and
  - The audience is no more than 500 people
- 3.3 Therefore the applicant does not have to specify this requirement.
- 3.4 A copy of the application is attached at Appendix 1 of the report
- 3.5 A copy of the blue notice is attached at Appendix 2 of the report

# 4. Other premises in the High Road Benfleet licensed by Castle Point Borough Council to sell/supply alcohol

4.1 The vicinity in which the application is made is a busy shopping and entertainment centre. There are 12 licensed premises within a quarter of a mile of the premises in existence and the Licensing Authority has not received any complaints from residents or the Police or other Relevant Authorities with respect to these businesses. #### 6. Essex Police

- 6.1 Essex Police have written to the applicant and have agreed the following amendments to the conditions under Annex 2 of the Premises Licence:
  - No alcohol shall be taken outside the premises after 22:30 each night of the week
  - Only toughened glass will be used throughout the premises including the outside terraced area
  - All exterior furniture shall be removed from the outside terraced area each night at the close of trading

- The premises shall operate a Challenge 25 policy and suitable signage shall be displayed, particularly around the bar area, informing patrons of this age verification policy
- Staff shall be trained in responsible sale of alcohol and training records shall be kept up to date and held at the premises. All training records shall be made available to a police constable or authorised officer upon request
- CCTV: A CCTV system shall be operating throughout each period of trading and shall have retention of recordings for at least 31 days. The system shall cover all licensed areas including the front terrace. A member of staff shall be on duty during trading hours that is trained on the systems operation and the downloading of recordings. Recordings shall be made available to a police constable or authorised officer upon request. Suitable signage shall be displayed informing the patrons that a CCTV system is in operation
- There will be a zero drugs tolerance policy in operation
- 6.2 It is noted that the existing CCTV system installation at the premises is adequate to fulfil the condition mentioned as above.
- 6.3 A copy of the letter from Essex Police is attached at Appendix 5 of the report.

# 7. Statement of Licensing Policy

- 7.1 The following extracts from the Council's Policy are brought to the general attention of the Sub-Committee.
  - "1.19 When considering applications, the Council will have regard to:-
    - the Licensing Act 2003 and the licensing objectives.
    - Government guidance issued under Section 182 of the Licensing Act 2003,
    - any supporting regulations
    - this statement of licensing policy
    - 1.20 This does not however undermine the rights of any person to apply under the 2003 Act for a variety of permissions and have the application considered on its individual merits, nor does it override the right of any person to make representations on any application or seek a review of a licence or certificate where they are permitted to do so under the 2003 Act.
    - 1.21 The Licensing Authority recognises that, in some circumstances, longer licensing hours for the sale of alcohol may help to avoid concentrations of customers leaving premises simultaneously and to reduce the potential for disorder. It also recognises that overly restrictive hours may inhibit the development of night-time economies that are important for investment, employment and tourism.
    - 1.22 When determining applications before a Licensing Sub-Committee, the Authority will seek to balance those factors against their duty to promote the four licensing objectives and the rights of residents to peace and quiet."

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

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



#### The grounds of the representation are detailed below

The environmental protection issues raised by this application are the control of noise from the playing of music live and recorded, and from customers at the premises for longer later hours than currently, so as to avoid public nuisance.

This premises is in a block of a dozen businesses all with maisonettes above. Most of the businesses are open during the working day only. Only one other business on this block is licensed and it doesn't play live music. In my opinion there is the potential for nuisance to be caused to nearby and adjacent residents.

We have other instances in the Borough where premises located in a block such as this with commercial premises on the ground floor and flats or maisonettes above have caused noise nuisance problems. It is a shame that residents have to suffer a nuisance which is both foreseeable and preventable before action can be taken.

We recently investigated noise nuisance from this premises due to the refurbishment works being carried out. Whilst this cannot be a consideration which can give rise to an objection under the Licensing Act and is being dealt with by separate enforcement action it did indicate the potential for noise nuisance from other activities at this premises which are a consideration under the Licensing Act and the works were not being carried out until such late hours as are proposed in this application.

The only possible smoking area is at the front of the premises which is located directly below the lounge and bedrooms of the maisonettes above.

The application does not indicate that the service of alcohol is conditional on the purchase of food which suggests the aim is to create a pub or bar which would be in my opinion totally unacceptable for this location.

The application does not include measures to mitigate noise nuisance to residents from the playing of live or recorded music on the premises or from customers coming in and out of the premises and smoking or sitting outside.

I don't believe that this business can operate the proposed hours either with recorded and certainly not with live music without causing a significant nuisance to local residents.

#### **CONDITIONS SOUGHT**

Following my visit to the above premise and my subsequent meeting with your area manager Toni BARNETT, as you were not available, I am writing to you to confirm that Essex Police seek certain conditions to the premises licence for the promotion of the licensing objectives. Those being:

- No alcohol shall be taken outside the premise after 22:30 each night of the week
- Only toughened glass will be used throughout the premise including the outside terraced area
- All exterior furniture shall be removed from the outside terraced area each night at the close of trading
- The premises shall operate a Challenge 25 policy and suitable signage shall be displayed, particularly around the bar area, informing patrons of this age verification policy
- Staff shall be trained in responsible sale of alcohol and training records shall be kept up to date and held at the premise. All training records shall be made available to a police constable or authorised officer upon request
- CCTV: A CCTV system shall be operating throughout each period of trading and shall have retention of recordings for at least 31 days. The system shall cover all licensed areas including the front terrace. A member of staff shall be on duty during trading hours that is trained on the systems operation and the downloading of recordings. Recordings shall be made available to a police constable or authorised officer upon request. Suitable signage shall be displayed informing the patrons that a CCTV system is in operation
- There will be a zero drugs tolerance policy in operation



I would like to further confirm that your area manager Ms Toni BARNETT was very helpful during my visit and she indicated that you would freely agree to these conditions.

It is noted that your existing CCTV system installation is adequate to fulfil the condition mentioned in this document.

Also, you will find enclosed information of right to work checks for employees which is for your guidance.

I would be grateful if you could send confirmation of your agreement to the conditions sought by Essex Police to the Castle Point Council Licensing Officer (copied to me please) to enable me to process this application promptly.

APPENDIX 6

- 1.14 In preparing this statement of licensing policy, the Council has had regard to and consulted those involved in its local strategies on crime prevention, planning, transport, culture, tourism and economic development, to ensure the proper coordination and integration of the aims and actions of these policies. Review and amendment of these strategies will be considered for their impact on this statement of licensing policy. See appendix "M" and "N".
- 1.15 Further, arrangements will be made for the Licensing Committee to receive reports, when appropriate, on the needs of the local tourist economy to ensure that these are reflected in their considerations. The Licensing Committee will also be appraised of the local employment situation and the need for new investment and employment, where appropriate.
- 1.16 To ensure proper integration with the Council's planning policies, the Licensing Committee will provide reports to the Planning Committee, where appropriate, on the situation regarding licensed premises in the area, including the general impact of alcohol related crime and disorder, to enable the planning committee to have regard to such matters when making its decisions.
- 1.17 The Council recognises its responsibilities under the Race Relations Act, 1976, as amended by the Race Relations (Amendment) Act, 2000. The Equality Act 2006, the Disability Discrimination Act 2005 and other related legislation. The impact of this policy on race relations, equality issues and disabled people will be monitored through the Council's equality and diversity policies and strategies and the Licensing Authority will take these responsibilities into account when dealing with applications.

# **Regulated Entertainment**

1.18 Having regard to the Council's Cultural Strategy and the International Covenant on Economic, Social and Cultural Rights (ICESCR) ratified in 1976, a diverse provision of cultural activities is welcomed for the benefit of communities. The Council will monitor the licensing of regulated entertainment, especially with regard to live music and dancing, theatrical performances, circuses, etc. to ensure that such events are promoted without unreasonable restrictions being imposed, which would discourage such events. The Council will need to balance the natural concern to prevent disturbance in neighbourhoods with the wider cultural benefits, particularly the cultural benefits for children. Advice and guidance on this matter will be sought from the Council's Head of Partnership or other appointed officer.

# **Applications**

- 1.19 When considering applications, the Council will have regard to:-
  - the Licensing Act 2003 and the licensing objectives,

- Government guidance issued under Section 182 of the Licensing Act 2003.
- any supporting regulations
- this statement of licensing policy
- 1.20 This does not however undermine the rights of any person to apply under the 2003 Act for a variety of permissions and have the application considered on its individual merits, nor does it override the right of any person to make representations on any application or seek a review of a licence or certificate where they are permitted to do so under the 2003 Act.
- 1.21 The Licensing Authority recognises that, in some circumstances, longer licensing hours for the sale of alcohol may help to avoid concentrations of customers leaving premises simultaneously and to reduce the potential for disorder. It also recognises that overly restrictive hours may inhibit the development of night-time economies that are important for investment, employment and tourism.
- 1.22 When determining applications before a Licensing Sub-Committee, the authority will seek to balance those factors against their duty to promote the four licensing objectives and the rights of residents to peace and quiet.
- 1.23 When the Council is considering any application, it will avoid duplication with other regulatory regimes, so far as possible, and does not intend to use the licensing regime to achieve outcomes that can be achieved by other legislation. In particular, its licensing functions will be discharged separately from its functions as the local planning authority.
  - However, applications for premises licences for permanent commercial premises should normally be from businesses with planning consent for the property concerned. (Other permissions may be applicable to licensed premises and applicants are expected to ensure that such permissions are obtained where necessary.)
- 1.24 When one part of the Council seeks a premises licence from the licensing authority, the licensing committee and its officers will consider the matter from an entirely neutral standpoint. If relevant representations are made, for example, by local residents or the police, they will be considered fairly by the committee. Those making representations genuinely aggrieved by a positive decision in favour of a local authority application by the licensing authority may appeal to the magistrates' court and thereby receive an independent review of any decision made.
- 1.25 In all cases, applicants and those making representation in respect of applications to the Council have a right of appeal to the Magistrates' Court against the decisions of the Council.
- 1.26 Appendix "P" provides applicants with the details of the application process, having regard to the Licensing Act 2003, the regulations, statutory guidance and local practice and procedures. It should be noted that incomplete applications will not be accepted but will be returned with an explanation of why it is incomplete.
