Environment Officers Geoff King and Stuart Spindler attended site to conduct an unannounced site inspection which was prompted due to noise reports.

Site Manager and Technically Competent Manager conducted the site tour, described the site and it's processes and answered all questions.

Previous site visit

Compliance Assessment Report 71088/0341281 from the visit conducted on 13/03/2019 contained no breaches.

Site visit conducted on 16/09/2019

No breaches detected.

Activities seen: Waste metal was being delivered to site and moved from the tipping locations either into bays or containers or the shearer.

The processes which were identified on site as being noisy and which could potentially be investigated or changed are the only ones which will be mentioned in this Compliance Assessment Report.

One noise generating activity was changed on site as soon as it was identified. The grab crane which placed heavy metal into an upturned shipping container is now placing the arm of the crane into the container and only releasing its waste when it touches the waste already in the container. i.e. the drop height has been reduced.

Another noise generating activity is where the grab crane near to the shearer got near to the bottom of the waste pile to be moved. It dragged the waste metal from one pile to another. Please consider if rather than dragging waste you can use another method such as the wire which was seen to be used by both cranes to clear their tipping areas prior to new deliveries being made.

Action:

Please investigate whether this activity can be changed to reduce noise levels. Please provide me with an email/written response of the changes or why it cannot be changed by 04/10/2019.

The mechanical/engine noise from shearer is one of the noises which can be heard from Church Road. and informed me of the shearer and it's operations and it efficiency.

Although no breaches were identified during the site inspection I would suggest the following actions be taken and included in your site diary:

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- 1. Record wind direction and speed each day.
- 2. Tool box talks to site workers informing them of noise reports and show them how to reduce noise such as placing the grab arm on waste rather than dropping waste etc.
- 3. Setup a few locations which are visited during waste processing hours to determine noise levels and what the noises are. Locations to be considered are: Junction of Church rd and Spencer Rd. Keswick Rd. Hesten Lodge Wellbeing hub.

Please also consider if there is any infrastructure changes that could be made which would help contain noise.
